

To access the library from off campus, go to our website: http://kcfac.kilgore.edu/library. You must be in the library's system to gain access to our services. When accessing databases, a window will appear asking for your last name and your password. The instructions will tell you how to determine your password. Enter this information in the boxes provided, and begin your research!

We will meet in our Bibliographic Instruction room, or even in your classroom, and help your students along the road to information literacy.

Of course, time is a factor when planning your classes. If you are unable to bring your class over, you can recommend they come to the library to visit with a librarian, or, they can print out the handout for their research area from our subject guides. Additionally, we have an online tutorial available for all students on our web page.

Dual Credit Classes

Interlibrary Loan

If you need materials that are not available from the Randolph C. Watson Library, don't panic. Just complete the Interlibrary Loan form at the Circulation Desk, or online at the library's website. We'll see if another library will loan us the materials for your use. However, keep in mind that Interlibrary Loans take an average of 5 days to arrive. Don't wait until the last minute to order your materials!

Reserves

Do you have important information for your students to read but limited available resources? Don't let the first student to reach the library check out all the materials, leaving the rest of your class with nothing. Put it on Reserve! Complete the form at the Circulation Desk, or on the website under Library Services/Faculty. We'll keep your copy of an item behind the Circulation Desk. Your students can then come to the library to read the materials, or to make their own copies.

Purchase Requests

We are always looking for new materials to add to our collection. If you know of materials that would be good additions to our collection, please let us know. Just send a list through campus mail or email, or contact any of the librarians with your requests. We at the library know that you, the faculty members, are our best resources for recommending materials for your area. Please keep us in mind when you come across new items that will benefit your students' learning experience.

Check Out Policy

It is generally our policy to allow faculty to check out items for the semester. However, you need to renew those items at the end of the Fall Semester, if you will need them for the Minimester or Spring. At the end of the Spring semester, we require all items be returned to the library for inventory. Items that are not returned will be charged to your department. We reserve the right to recall materials at any time.

Popular Reading

We have contracted to lease volumes of popular reading from McNaughton Book Service. Eventually, we either send the books back to the company, or buy the more popular ones. When we buy them, they are added to the regular collection. This diverse set of books is housed on the first floor of the library. We also have popular paperback books, which have been donated by others. If you have gently used paperbacks, consider donating them to our collection.
